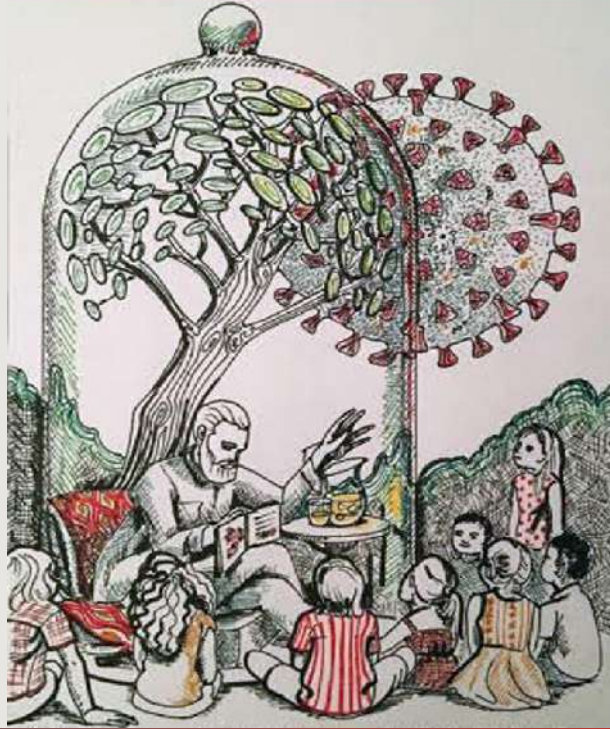

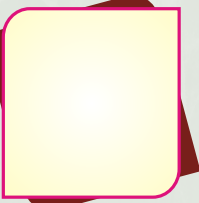
May God bless you all with the courage to move forward in these demanding times of the day.

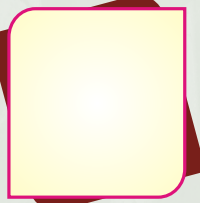

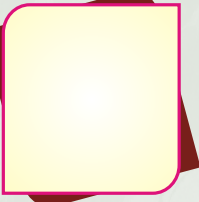
